# **DESIGN INTENT**

Provide a repeating design element to break up the linearity of the street, through tree planting and bluestone paving banding to provide a visual cue to slow vehicles. The design aims to support the change of Rose Street to a shared zone and the priority of pedestrians over vehicle movement.

**CONCEPT OPTION 2: LONG TERM** 

**ROSE STREET** 

The design is based on a change from two way traffic flow to be one way traffic flow along Rose Street, from Brunswick Street to Nicholson Street.

## **DESIGN PRINCIPLES**

- Enable better use of Rose Street by people, through provision of spaces which break up the linearity of the road and slow vehicles.
- Treat Rose Street as a priority space for pedestrians and cyclists, not vehicles.
- Provide visual cues to all users that Rose Street is a shared
- Respond to the favourable microclimate on the south side of Rose Street.

### **LIMITATIONS**


It is acknowledged that there are some functional constraints on the street, identified through site analysis and consultation, which are not able to be addressed due to the limits of the budget for this project.
