#### City of Yarra Open Space Strategy

Principle	Aim
Accessible	Provide open space that is easily accessible and appeals to people of all ages and abilities and is well serviced by a range of sustainable transport options.
Adaptable	Design and manage open space to accommodate changing community needs and other influences including climate change.
Cultural	Recognise, protect and support diverse Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultural heritage and historical values, including contemporary cultural values, in existing and new open space.
Diverse	Reflect the natural, social, urban and cultural diversity of Yarra and meet the diverse range of organised and informal recreational needs in open space.
Ecological	Enhance and link ecologically viable remnants and established urban bushland to improve biodiversity values.
Equitable	Ensure the public open space network is inclusive and freely open and accessible to everyone.
Sustainable	Design and manage open space to support sustainable water use; contribute to urban greening; mitigate urban heat island effect; support large canopy trees; promote sustainable transport options; and contribute to the liveability of higher density precincts in the city.


The following are usage types we've identified to be included in the concept design. They are drawn from the brief, *Your Say Yarra* and the *Yarra Open Space Strategy*.



- Lighting






#### Rectangular Design Approach

**Curved Design Approach** 





CONCEPTUAL IDEA: MESSY GARDEN, FORMAL EDGES

• These images show techniques to informalise formal edges through the use of planting, contrast and colour and sculpture.

Set within a somewhat formal layout, there exists the opportunity for landscape elements to 'break through' and to 'cross boundaries'.











- Images showing how signifiers, both **subtle** and **explicit**, can help to communicate inclusion and acceptance.
- Loosely terming signifiers as **ACTIVE** forms of **expression of support/solidarity/acceptance**
- They can be sanctioned (through Council etc), or occure organically (grafitti etc) and are often by marginalised groups. They can occur inside or adjacent to space.
- Some types: murals, grafitti, planting, any visual indicator. A painted door













 Sculpture as play can subtlely communicate inclusion and flexibility due to the non-perscriptive nature of it. It's for everyone. For looking as well as play.

• Where structures stay below 500mm, they do not require impact absorbing materials and can sit within lawn or paving. It doesn't only read as playground, and multiple ages can use it.















• These images show forms and arrangements of furniture to activate edges and spaces through **fixed** and **interactive** design.
